The Microsystem: Includes your direct environment. This means it shows the influence people such as your family, teachers, peers, and teammates have had on your life. As well as how your school, home, and work have impacted your life.

The Exosystem: This includes part of your life that you have no say in, meaning things that affect you, but not because of your own actions. An example would be moving due to a parent's promotion at work.

The Macrosystem: This refers to the culture you live in. This system involves the whole outer world such as, politics, values, economy, and laws and how those change and play a role in your life.

*Each system is related to one another and items within each influence you in your own special way because everyone's lives are different.





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
